

May 9: Gulimina Mahamuti, Pianist (Reed Hall 160)

A native of Karamay City in western China and a faculty member of Capital University Conservatory of Music in Columbus, Ohio, Dr. Gulimina Mahamuti enjoys an active career as a soloist, collaborative pianist, piano teacher, and lecturer in both China and the United States. She is the first Chinese Uighur to receive a Doctorate of Musical Arts in Piano Performance from the United States. Her performances have taken her to Canada, major cities throughout China, and the Midwest and East Coast of the United States.





May 23: Jamie Kennedy, photographer and Kelly Urquhart, painter (Reed Hall 174)

Husband and wife team, Jaime Kennedy and Kelly Urquhart will present works on paper that have elements of sculpture, photography, drawing, and digital media. Jaime Kennedy is an Assistant Professor in the School of Visual Communication Design at Kent State and Kelly Urquhart received her M.F.A. from Miami University-Ohio. Both maintain an active schedule of art exhibitions.
