clude with a showcase performance of Spanish composer Enrique Granados' "Cant De Les Estrelles (Song of the Stars)" by OWU parttime assistant professor

Gulimina Mahamuti on piano and guest Janet Guetle on Gray Chapel's 4,644-pipe Rexford Keller Memorial Organ.

The world is celebrating the 150th anniversary of Granados's birth this year, and Mahamuti has been performing piano recitals paying tribute to the influential composer and his music. She performs extensively

in major cities in the United States, Canada, Denmark, Hungary, Turkey, and China, with broadcasts on radio and state TV. She has given recitals at the invitation of the Turkish Ambassador in Hungary, at Carnegie Hall in New York, at Trinity Church in Boston, and at Memorial Church of Harvard University.
